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YOUR RESPONSIBILITY WHEN SELLING

On the sale of a property, you (the seller) must lodge a form with the Queensland Land Registry stating whether or not compliant smoke alarms are installed in the property and that the purchaser has been informed of the fact.

Your solicitor will usually lodge this form on your behalf after receiving your declaration. Large fines apply for false declarations.

What are the legislative requirements?



Smoke alarms must:

- Be photoelectric (AS 3786-2014)
- Be interconnected with every other required smoke alarm in the dwelling so they all activate together
- Be either hardwired or powered by a non-removable ten-year battery

Smoke alarms must be installed on each storey:

- In every bedroom
- In hallways which connect bedrooms and the rest of the dwelling; or
- If there is no hallway, between the bedrooms and other parts of the storey; and
- If there are no bedrooms on a storey at least one smoke alarm must be installed in the most likely path of travel to exit the dwelling

How can you be certain of compliance?

It is highly recommended that you obtain a **Compliance Certificate**. It is common for a purchasers' solicitors to only accept certificates as formal notification prior to settling.
